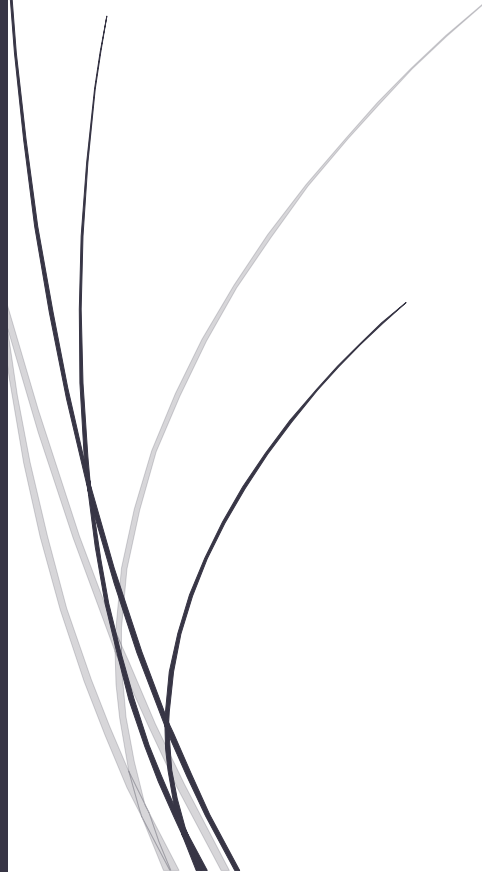

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Aims and Objectives

- ◆ To provide Islamic Education to the children and youth in Saskatoon
- ◆ To give students the opportunity to meet other Muslims to strengthen the ummah
- ◆ To teach and encourage the students to keep learning about their deen (religion)
- ◆ To teach children how they can implement the Sunnah of the Prophet (SAW) into their daily lives
- ◆ To create a fun, energetic, and exciting environment for students to learn in.

Academic Program

- ◆ The Islamic Arabic Weekend School (IAWS) runs 10 classes on Sundays for women, young teens, and children. These classes include:
 - KG
 - Level 1
 - Level 2
 - Level 3
 - Level 4
 - Level 5
 - Youth Group
 - Girls Halaqah Group
 - Ladies Surah Noor Course
 - Intermediate Adults Arabic Grammar – Madinah Arabic Book 2
- ◆ Students must be **at least** 5 years old (by October 8th) to enrol in the KG program
- ◆ Each level is divided by age group but in exceptional cases students are promoted to a higher level because of their knowledge.
- ◆ Students in the Youth Group can be in grade 7 or 8 and can stay on if they choose to do so. The maximum age limit is **16 years**.
- ◆ **All fees are non-refundable.**

Code of Conduct

Drop-off and Pick up

- ◆ It is the responsibility of the parents to bring the students to school on time (at **10:00 am**).

- ◆ Parents should arrive at **1:30pm** to either take their children home or stay for Dhuhr Salaah. There is **no supervision** after school (after **1:30pm**).
- ◆ If alternative transportation for the child has been arranged or if the child needs to leave early for whatever reason, the teacher must be informed to let the student go.

Student Expectations

We are all Muslims and should have the best behavior towards our teachers and fellow students.

- ◆ Students should come to class prepared with paper, pencils, completed homework, and any other material that the teacher has requested.
- ◆ Do not make disruptive noises or gestures during class time or leave the classroom without permission
- ◆ Treat others and the property of others with respect
- ◆ Students should come to class on time
- ◆ If the student misses any class for whatever reason, **the student and the parent** are responsible for contacting the teacher for the missed classwork and homework.
- ◆ Students are expected to dress modestly
- ◆ Girls should wear hijab and boys should not wear shorts above the knees.

End of Year Awards

- ◆ Attendance Award - any student with an attendance of 90% or higher; this means you can miss a total of 3 classes throughout the year
- ◆ Best Behaviour Award – determined by the teacher
- ◆ Academic Excellence Award – given to student who exceeded expectations in all three subject areas
- ◆ Islamic Fair Winners – First, second, and third place winners of the Islamic Fair held in February
- ◆ Most Improved – students who have shown significant improvement over the academic year.

If students are guilty of misbehaving on more than 5 accounts, the IAWS has the right to withhold any awards that the student may be eligible for.

Subsidizing Program

- ◆ In this program, parents can **anonymously** pay the tuition fees for students (\$180 per student) who are unable to do so. It is great Sadaqah Jariyah for anyone who chooses to get involved, Inshaa Allah.
- ◆ Alhamdulillah, this program was extremely successful last year.
- ◆ This can be paid at any time during the school year

Library Program for Students

- ◆ To use the library facility, we are requesting parents to register their child(ren) by clicking [here](#). This is a short **one time** application (if you fill it once, you *never* have to fill it out again). Please note that students who are not on our library membership list will **not** be allowed to check out books.

- ◆ We have created our library online allowing you easy access to the books we have available. Please follow the instructions below to view the books:

 2. Click on **Sign into your account**
 3. Enter the username: iaws
 4. Enter the password: bismiAllah
 5. Select **Students**
 6. Select your child's name
 7. Enter the password assigned to your family (You will get this once you have registered your children to our library. If you have forgotten your password, please send us an email at islamicarabicweekendschool@gmail.com)
 8. Select **Checkout & Read**
 9. Browse the book selection and checkout the books you would like to read

Library Rules:

1. Students can check out a maximum of 5 books for a period of two weeks.
2. Overdue books will be charged \$2/week.
3. If a student loses a book, parents will be asked to replace the book.

Once you have registered, you will receive an email with instructions to grant you access to our library online. You can browse through the books and select the ones you would like to check out. These books can be picked up on **January 6th 2019**, Inshaa Allah.

Youth Group Program

This year the Youth Group will focus on completing short courses. At the end of each course, students will receive a certificate and progress to the next course. This will be a fast-paced program and if the assessment day is missed by any student, they will not receive the certificate for that course.

Students who will attend and give the final assessments from the Youth Group will have the following Course completion certificates:

Girls Halaqah Group

1. Understanding Quran Course: The aim of this course is to teach students Arabic grammar and **learn** 50% of all the vocabulary in the Quran.
2. Contemporary Issues and other issues that are commonly brought up amongst the youth.

Ladies Surah Noor Course Part 1 and 2

Ladies will be taught basic Tajweed rules, Tafsir, word-to-word, and grammar (optional). Students who register will receive the course work via email. Please note that some classes will be online. Class offered in Urdu and English.

Intermediate Adults Arabic Grammar

This is the Madinah Arabic Book 2 course. Please note that some classes will be online.
